

This must be a dream... everywhere I look there are Porsches. More than I saw at the factory years ago. More than I ever imagined possible. Race Porsches, street Porsches, rare and unusual Porsches. Nearly every Porsche every built is represented on one small peninsula in central California this weekend in August in celebration of 50 years of Porsche building the best loved sports cars in the world.

The factory brought 20 cars from their famous museum in Zuffenhausen. They include this year's LeMan's winner, the first LeMans overall winner and the first Porsche to race LeMans. We see the 959 which won the Paris to Dakar and the first Porsche Formula One from 1962 driven by Dan Gurney to win the French Grand Prix its maiden year. There is the McLaren TAG w/Porsche power that enjoyed 25 GP victories from 1983 to 1987. The Telefunken 550, RS61, 904, Carrera 6, 910 long tail, 911RSR, 917, 935, 936 long tail, and the 962 plus more. All of them are race winners lovingly maintained in original condition by the factory curator. And they were displayed in a huge tent complete with stage lighting, flooring w/gray carpeting and a multi-screen video presentation behind this year's LeMans winner. Not even Germany saw a presentation for the 50th Anniversary near what is assembled here in Monterey.

And then there were the pits filled with huge numbers of race Porsches. Imagine seeing and hearing all these great cars in action on the track once again... nine 550RSK's nose to tail through the famous Corkscrew or five 917's on the track together with those flat 12's shrieking to redline. We also saw and heard the 917PA, 917-10 and 917-30 CanAm

cars including Mark Donohue's 1100 horsepower monster with twin turbos and those wonderful "pop-off" valves relieving turbo pressure. Then there was the 935 "Moby Dick" shooting flames 3 feet out the rear approaching every corner - eat your heart out Lori and Memo!!

Personally, as a 944 Turbo S fan, I found the 924GTP-LM to be one of the most interesting cars of the weekend. There were only two ever built and the other is in a bunker in Zuffenhausen. Jim Edwards of Arizona, who just completed a restoration before bringing the car to Monterey, now owns the other. It has the first Porsche designed, water cooled 2.5L engine, custom 16-valve dual overhead cam head, KKK turbo, and 420hp to 510hp (depending on boost level). Although virtually none of the parts interchange with a

street 944, it was the 944's precursor. Raced at LeMan in 1981, it finished 7th overall and during the rain was as high in the standings as 3rd. Most amazingly, the GTP ran the entire 24 hour race with only fuel, tires and brakes and was proclaimed by Derek Bell as the best handling Porsche he's ever driven. Derek in fact still owns and drives a 924 Carrera GT.

Great drivers were in abundance that weekend. A list including George Follmer, Hurley Haywood, Brian Redman, Vic Elford, Jurgen Barth, Derek Bell, and Milt Minter covers only some of the talent present. Hurley and Jurgen put on a particularly wonderful show on Sunday where a photo finish gives Hurley the win after charging from mid pack in a 9146 to beat Jurgen Barth in a terrific yellow 911S.

What a thrill these drivers provided and they were constantly available for autographs and a handshake.

But this hasn't even begun to cover the absolutely huge number of street Porsche represented this weekend. There was a Porsche corral lined with over 750 Porsches all in a row, including this author's Stone Grey Metallic '88 944 Turbo S! In the corral you could find nearly every model built including four new 911 Turbo S models, a very rare 916, a 1956 Porsche full 4 passenger coupe, the 911R, and a red and tan 356 Speedster with 3,156 original miles! It was estimated over 4,000 Porsche were at Monterey that weekend and it is believed to be the largest group ever assembled in one place.

Friday evening at the gorgeous and equally historic Carmel Mission, about 1500 Porsche owners attended a dinner hosted by the Monterey Region of PCA which proved to be the hottest ticket in town. We heard a heart wrenching tribute to Dr. Ferry Porsche by his son as well as Dr. Wiedeking's commitment for "Porsche forever Porsche" and remaining independent in this day and age of mergers. Most of the race drivers were in attendance to both sign autographs and speak at the podium. I believe it was Vic Elford who reminisced about the 917 saying Mark Donohue once commented that the 917-30 didn't have enough power! Well the engineers were amazed and asked how much power would be enough? Mark responded, "Enough to keep the rear wheels spinning until I have to brake"!

If all this wasn't enough Porsche overload, on Monday the local regions hosted a Drivers Education event where I had the opportunity to experience Laguna Seca up close and personal. The only word I find that comes close is:

WOW!!! Wide and smooth, this track was designed by an artist who new about driving challenges. The Corkscrew features two tight turns, which drop through the largest vertical elevation, change in racing – a very exciting spot and the track's most famous feature. Oh, and the first turn is absolutely blind. Another interesting spot is the Andretti hairpin. This is at the end of the fastest straight on the track where the last 1/4th is a sharp downhill before the 190-degree hairpin. I had a hard time keeping on the throttle deep enough into this one. Nothing a little more practice wouldn't cure!!

Although compared to the Monterey Historics my 6600 miles trip seems dull, it was also an event I strongly recommend every Porsche owner duplicate with their cars. Montana was made for us - how many places can you drive 500 miles on two lane roads in 6 hours legally? Or Northern California at the beginning of the Pacific Coast Highway where for 22 miles I "endured" virtually constant 1st and 2nd gear driving with more turns than even God could count and only two other cars to be seen. Or Nevada where 6 hours of triple digit speed was interrupted only 4 times by towns. Yea, I know this wasn't legal but it sure was fun and there really weren't many cars to pass. This route took me very near the home of the Silver State Challenge that I believe one of our members recently enjoyed. National Parks formed the cornerstones of this journey and included Glacier, Redwoods, Sequoia, Yosemite, Grand Tetons, and Yellowstone as well as Devil's Tower and Mount Rushmore National Monuments. Although my daughter Christine shared some of the driving duties on her permit during this 3 week vacation, about 6200 of them were driven by me... partly because I was greedy and couldn't get enough of

Although there is not likely to be another excuse as good as the Monterey Historics for a trip out west, those roads out there are incredible. In some ways I think it's even better than driving on the track. Constant variety and better scenery are two advantages. Just stay off the interstates, keep the pace to 6/10^{ths} or less and plan the trip to connect interesting roads. I'm sure hooked... this is my third cross-country trip in three years! Try it, you'll like it. *Dennis Voss*



The New 1999 911 Carrera 4

ATLANTA, Sept. 25 – PCNA and Porsche Cars Canada released initial details of Porsche's latest allwheel drive vehicle, the 1999 Porsche 911 Carrera 4.

Scheduled to appear in North American Porsche dealerships in early "99, the new 911 Carrera 4 shares its styling cues with the "99 911 Carrera released in the spring of this year. Additionally, the new Carrera 4 incorporates an all-wheel drive system utilizing a viscous clutch as well as an exclusive new Porsche Stability Management System designed to optimize traction, braking and handling.

The new Carrera 4 is also the first all-wheel drive Porsche to be equipped with the Tiptronic S automatic transmission system. This five-speed automatic gearbox is offered as an option in place of the standard six-speed manual transmission.

Like the "99 911 Carrera, the new 911 Carrera 4 is powered by a liquid-cooled, horizontally opposed, six-cylinder engine producing 296 horsepower and 258 ft. lbs. of torque.

The 1999 Porsche 911 Carrera 4 will make its

public debut in January of next year at auto shows in Detroit and Los Angeles.


