



The following is an account of our weekend at Laguna Seca Raceway

The following is an account of our weekend at Laguna Seca Raceway covering the FIA-GT race and the WSC race. I had trouble deciding how to write this article. I took into account that most of you have been on a track, that your are a club member, and more than likely you've been to a racing event or two. It was Saturday afternoon when

it hit me. Memo and I (photographer) had been out in the morning getting familiar with the tack, we had several excellent photo positions already picked out. However, the weather was not cooperating and it began raining. Not until they shut the track down during qualifying due to mud over the track did we find our way to the tower. As I was sitting there, drenched, observing the next hour or so from inside did it really sink in. I was missing the real stuff. Yea like the other journalist can get the information form the wire and take notes as it is being commentated but that's not the same. I came here to enjoy the atmosphere of racing, and to tell you the truth it just doesn't happen up in the tower. So I began making notes of what I saw and felt going on around me, things you're not going to pick up watching the broadcast.

#### Saturday October 24th

• Weather stops the morning qualifying session for FIA-GT after 18 minutes. Just as the GT 2 cars were allowed on the track, with only having seen the GT1 cars of Persson, Zakspeed and Porsche AG. The track was red flagged due to two mudslides across the track, one of which crossing the more notorious Corkscrew. Track was reopened to start the WSC and GT race at 12:30.

#### WSC and GT Race

- Race starts as scheduled as the mud has been cleared and marshals give the ok. However, due to heavy fog in the Corkscrew (less then 50ft) the race starts under yellow. Timing of the race starts at lap # 3.
- <u>Race Results:</u> Porsche having two top ten finishes with Larry Schumacher finishing the season in a Porsche 911 turbo as the GT2 champion Butch Leitzinger clinches the overall WSC titles by finishing  $4^{th}$  overall today.
- I wish I was able to follow this race more closely, however I had my hands full just keeping up with the FIA-GT events.

#### FIA-GT Afternoon Qualifying Session

- Porsche AG third and fifth for the pole, Zakspeed Porsche qualifies eight.
- Qualifying Results: pole position belongs to the Mercedes of Ludwig/Zonta #2 with a qualifying time of 1:16:154, sharing the front role with the Mercedes #1 of Schneider/Webber. Row 2; Porsche AG of Dalmas/McNish #7 and the DAMS Panoz of Bernard/Brabham #3, The Porsche AG of Alzen/Mueller #8 to start in row 3 and row 4 finds the Zakspeed Porsche of Bartels/Angelelli
- Driver Quotes: Dalmas "We had a good run in qualifying and I'm happy". "We will try to win the race if possible...if they (Mercedes leave a space I'll take it!" "We have a good chance for a podium tomorrow", said Uwe Alzen of the #8 Porsche qualifying 5th.
- Porsche wins pole for GT2. The Roock #56 of Ortelli and Huertgen (the only female driver) claim their second pole of the season.
- The difference between the FIA GT and WSC series you ask? Well they lap almost 2 seconds faster then there American counter parts. It is an awesome site.
- Special note: As I watch these guys smoke em (locking the tires) as they enter the Corkscrew I ask myself is this a mistake or is it a technique. As it happens time and time again I begin to think it's more a set of circumstances. (more on this in the web site article a great photo too)

## Sunday October 25, Race Day for FIA-GT

#### Warm-up

• I am on pit row at 9:15 and I am amazed as to how quite it is, virtually little movement, the warm-up is scheduled to start at 9:30. As I watch the teams start rolling out the equipment and getting into place I sit in awe. These guys get the entire team and all of its equipment, (Continued on page 5)

car and crew in place in about 15 minutes how do they do that?

- And why does the pit crew of Porsche AG were due rags with skulls? Is it for the competition or maybe a personal physique thing?
- Business never stops. As the driver change takes place between McNish and Dalmas no sooner is McNish out of the car, has helped Dalmas get into place the car speeds away helmet is off, does he have posters put in front of him to sign. Then he rejoins the crew to refocus on the real business of the day, well obviously that depends on who you're talking to.
- Once the grid clears and the morning warm up has completed all is quite with the exception of a lone group standing in a circle. This group consists of non other than Porsche project manager Norbert Singer driver Angelelli of Zakspeed racing being flanked by Michelin technician Gilles Thomas and other blue jacketed Michelin men.

#### 11:05 Post race Press Conference

- The Drivers are being corralled into their proper assigned seats. This is a well-orchestrated event as is everything about racing. The drivers are all in place with the exception of several of the Mercedes drivers. Klaus Ludwig joins the group late only to receive jeers from his fellow drivers and fittingly conducts a simultaneous jeer.
- Klaus Ludwig is given a piece of the Laguna Seca track with a plaque commemorating his career. This will be Klaus Ludwig's final race as he has announced his retirement.
- I am now in the Mercedes pits just observing as Memo is taking photos of the action. I had not noticed the tribute that Mercedes had given Ludwig until I had seen Memo's pictures, it turns out they had his photo on the roof along with a long list of his accomplishments.

#### Start of the FIA - GT Race.



- As the 3-minute horn sounds even I get butterflies anticipating the start of the race. It's like I'm at Waterford lining up for grid position. As the drivers get the 1-minute horn the engines are revved, I'm in turn 4 with earplugs and can here them from here.
- $\bullet$  Lap 1- The #80 Mustang had gone off track along with the Viper of #53 in turn 4.
- Lap 7 the Porsche of McNish has over taken the #1 Mercedes.
- $^{ullet}$  Lap 22 finds the Porsche GT2 #62 locking up and missing the Corkscrew only to hit the tire wall just where Memo is standing. The car retires due to a punctured oil cooler.
- $^{ullet}$  Lap #39 #12 Mercedes of Gounon over takes the #11 Mercedes of Maylander. This was the best battle of the day, Gounon was putting it all on the line, or as I saw off the line.
- Lap 44 Porsche #7 McNish retires in turn 7, I later heard this was due to clutch problems.
- Note: At this point in the race I'm observing the cars on the track as they pass though the corkscrew seeing if I can pick up any pointers. Bad idea! The only pointers I see are those that I've been told are bad. I'm talking about the little things like locking up the tires. And what about this, obvious acceleration but what's that I see brake lights? Would this mean left foot breaking? Hum!
- Lap 127 Fastest lap is set by Zonta #2 Mercedes at 1:19:094
- Lap 139 Final Lap

#### Race Results

- (1) Ludwig/Zonta in the Mercedes # 2 this also clinched the Drivers Championship. (2) Schneider/Webber, # 1Mercedes (3) Alzen/Mueller, #8 Porsche, the # 6 Porsche, Bartels/Angelelli of Zakspeed Racing finishes 5th.
- Overall Porsche took 5 of the top 10 finishing positions

#### Quotes

- Form Porsche driver Jorg Mueller, "car was fantastic at times during the race and just pushed as hard as I could". Uwe Alzen (Porsche) on how he liked the course "liked it so much a fantastic course". "Liked the country and treatment for me it seem like a holiday when I get to drive in America but 1st, and I'm so happy for Klaus Ludwig it's so fantastic." (Alzen and Ludwig where teammates in 96.)
- And FIA GT Champion Klaus Ludwig on what's ahead "I think I'll stay in racing and I hope I stay with Mercedes". Teammate Zonta "the day was fantastic day for me also for my teammate he made a very good fantastic job today. I am pleased the team worked very hard all sea-

#### News from Porsche NA

1999 American Le Mans Series Schedule (PCA Editors News Service)

LAS VEGAS, NV, November 5 -- Don Panoz, owner of motorsports' newest series, the American Le Mans Series, announced today an eight-race schedule for 1999 including a seven-race live programming package with the NBC networks utilizing state of the art equipment and the highest quality production practices, including multiple in-car cameras.

"I am very excited and pleased to be able to release the TV package and proposed schedule so early," said Don Panoz, founder of the American Le Mans Series The American Le Mans Series (ALMS) features prototype sports cars, GT-1, GT-2 and GT-3 class cars with teams such as Panoz, Porsche, Ferrari, BMW, Dodge and Chevrolet. The races will be of varying lengths including the Petit Le Mans, a 1,000 mile endurance event to be held October 16 at Road Atlanta. All races will be sanctioned by Professional Sports Car Racing ("SPORTS CAR").

Dave Maraj, owner of Champion Porsche said, "Champion Racing will support the series 100 percent. The television package and race schedule will give sports car racing in America the kind of exposure it

needs and deserves.

Bill Donaldson, executive director of the series said, "We're building on the successful model of the Petit Le Mans last month. The television package will be the strongest TV undertaking in the history of sports car racing in North America. With the SuperStars of Auto Racing Series also being announced today to join the Women's Global GT Series, we feel the diversification of the show will be an attractive package to the fans," he added.





#80 Goes off track and gets some unexpected company

## My Take on Laguna Seca

I have not touched my camera or my 400mm. lens since our Costa Rica trip four years ago. Last time I took a picture above water it was a howling monkey in the rain forest. I used to shoot F1 when they where in Detroit, no offence but I quit going to Detroit Grand Prix since FIA pulled out. Alcohol burning Indy cars are not the same. And the GT cars are worthy, and Laguna Seca is a beautiful course with a first class setup. Since we where privileged with GT passes we could go almost anywhere we wanted, (although I did manage to get kicked out of a couple places). I was excited about this, I was going to shoot something above water, no scuba gear.

The first hour we discussed which turn we should be at and how to get there and so on. By the time Lori made up our minds it was pouring down rain which made me wish I had my under water cameras. So we took refuge under the Bridgestone Bridge between turn 3 and 4. Finally the rain stopped and the sun came up. This gave us a chance to walk around and find good spots to take photos and sharpen up our quick sand walking techniques. Those gravel traps are named wrong it should be named sticky quick sand specially when it is wet. 

## **Driving Techniques #2**

Proof Only Rich Suckers Can Have Everything

The following information specifically applies to driving an automobile on a closed track. This information is commonly known to "techies", but it is essential to the understanding of car set-up. The next article will deal woth overcoming a mishandling car. Understeer is a "push" or the front of the car sliding, therefore it will not turn in. Oversteer is "loose" or the rear of the car sliding, therefore pointing tooo far into the corner.

Front tire pressuer	Lower	Higher
Rear tire pressure	Higher	Lower
Front tire section	Larger	Smaller
Rear tire section	Smaller	Larger
Front wheel chamber	More negative	More positive

Front wheel toe	Toward toe-out	Toward toe-in
Rear wheel toe	Toward toe-in	Toward toe-out
Front wheel caster	More positive	More negative
Front springs	Soften	Stiffen
Rear spring	Stiffen	Soften
Front anti-sway bar	Soften (thinner)	Stiffen (thicker)
Rear anti-sway bar	Stiffen (thicker)	Soften (thinner)
Weight distribution	More rearward	More forward






