FROM THE LEFT LANE

FRANKFURT AUTO SHOW

I 'm starting to worry about myself. In our country where we parsimoniously guard our measly two weeks of vacation, I blow mine to go to an auto show. Well, that's not entirely true, but I did use my vacation to see the Frankfurt auto show this year. This would be my personal interpretation of the Declaration of Independence's "pursuit of happiness." This is acceptable behavior, right?

A Big Messe

Immediately after landing in Frankfurt, I got my rental car and headed for the show. The Frankfurt Internationale Automobil-Ausstellung (IAA) is held every other year (probably due to its size) at the Frankfurt Messe (convention center). The show was held in nine of the ten buildings at the center. (Rumor has it that the tenth building was used to house all of the people that passed out from walking. I was doing my best to get in.)

What's the show like? It's just like the Detroit autoshow that's held in January. It's also just like the SAE (Society of Automotive Engineers) show typically held in February. However, the Germans, being the way they are, decided that it would be better if the two shows were combined into one. This is the efficient way. This is the logical way. This is the Frankfurt auto show.

Armed with just a camera and a little map I picked up on the bus ride from the parking lot, I felt like Don Quixote had better odds against the windmills than I do against this show.

Show Impressions

I was there on a Monday and was surprised at how busy the show was (don't Germans work? Oh, yeah—they can get up to six weeks of vacation in their first year of work, while we get—oh, never mind). Although I had a map, I mostly wandered around, drifting from one building to another. The German manufacturers seemed to be pretty popular. Bugatti (now Volkswagen-owned) had a couple of new concept cars on display. I think the number of concept cars they've built since being owned by VW has now exceeded the total production volume they've ever had.

In one building, I stumbled on a display of 100 Years of Cars and the cars that debut in Frankfurt. One of these happened to be the McLaren F1, the original \$1,000,000 production car. I was contemplating the number of felonies I had to commit to bring this car back with me. I still am.

Eventually, I made it to the Porsche display. I tried to get to the rotating 911 Turbo, which made its debut at the show. It took some time to get to the front of the pack to see this car. It was pretty popular. There were a few things that I could see that differentiated it from the regular 911. There's the obvious new spoiler/whale tail in the back. There are also slits in the back bumper that is reminiscent of the 959. There are ducts in front of the rear wheels, similar to the Boxster. Up front, the headlights

front airdam is deeper with three openings. For those of you out there that must have the latest of everything, the wheels are new. They don't have the spin weld line that the previous turbo wheels had. I wonder how much these costs.

The new Boxster S also held its debut at the show, but you could never tell. There were very few people looking at it, probably because it looks just like the "normal" Boxster. There was, however, a considerable line waiting to sit in the new Turbo (Porsche actually lets people sit inside their cars at this show).

One of the most interesting things I saw at the show was the popularity of the Chevrolet products. While both the sporty Chevy Corvette and Camaro were at the show, the most popular American vehicles appeared to be the

2000 Porsche Boxster S Facts

new Boxster S, arriving in late fall 1999, builds on the foundation of the popular Boxster model and offers an even higher level of performance and standard features. A wider bore increases engine displacement over the standard Boxster engine to 3.2 liters. With power-boosting technology including dual-resonance air intake, VarioCam variable valve timing and an E-Gas electronic throttle, the Boxster S engine produces 250 horsepower and 225 lb.-ft. of peak torque. The engine produces 85 percent of its peak torque at just 2,000 rpm, giving the Boxster S outstanding response. To handle the extra power, the Boxster S includes a version of the six-speed manual transmission from the 911 Carrera, plus the larger, cross-drilled brake discs from that model. Larger wheels and tires and sport chassis tuning enhance the already-precise handling, and distinctive titanium-color trim sets the Boxster S apart from the standard Boxster. The 2000 Porsche Boxster S can accelerate from 0-60 miles per hour in just 5.7 seconds (0-100 kph in 5.9 seconds) versus 6.4 seconds (0-100 kph in 6.6 sec.) for the standard Boxster model.

Porsche added a third radiator to the Boxster S to handle cooling for the larger engine. (The standard Boxster uses two front-mounted radiators.) The central air intake for this radiator will quickly tip off the identity of a Boxster S. Inside, the Boxster S features unique instrument panel gauges with aluminum-color trim and gray faces. Aluminum-look door handles, shift lever and shifter bezel enhance the classic sports car appearance. Other significant enhancements include a new convertible roof with headliner and a three-spoke leather-covered steering wheel in place of the standard model's four-spoke wheel.

Extensive Porsche safety technology includes a patented crumple-zone body structure, dual front airbags, doormounted side airbags, anti-lock brakes and built-in supplemental safety bars. The standard power convertible roof lowers in just 12 seconds. The Boxster S shares the enhancements to the standard Boxster interior for 2000, including new soft-touch grain for the dashboard and interior trim. New standard colors for 2000 include Biarritz White and Speed Yellow. Rain Forest Green Metallic is a new optional color.




