#### 99 CHARITY AUTO CROSS







# GET TECHNICAL— Fast Facts for the 2000 911 Carrera 4

# 2nd in a series of the Porsche 2000 line up (Provided by PCNA)

Porsche pioneered the all-wheel drive sports car, and the new-generation 911 Carrera 4 delivers the highest level of driving dynamics the company has ever offered in a road car for North America. Porsche introduced the first all-wheel drive Carrera 4 in 1989. Safety technology in the current model includes a patented crumplezone body structure, dual front airbags, door-mounted side airbags and anti-lock brakes. The 911 Carrera 4 all-wheel drive system uses a viscous multi-plate clutch mounted just behind the front differential.

Porsche Stability Management provides the ultimate level of control by correcting for loss of grip at either the front or rear tires. The 911Carrera 4 exhibits superior traction on all road surfaces. However, Porsche designed the system to offer superior handling onmainly dry road surfaces -- the automaker did not intend the all-wheel drive system as anall-weather traction assistant.

The 911 Carrera 4 -- in both Coupe and Cabrioletstyles -- features a different wheel design than the standard 911 Carrera, as well as plainly visible titaniumcolor brake calipers. The rear engine hood carries a titanium-color "Carrera 4" logotype. The Cabriolet model features a one-touch power roof, an automatic deploying supplemental safety bar structure and a standard removable aluminum hardtop.

#### New for 2000

New for 2000: A new exhaust system helps boost horsepower in 911 Carrera 4 from 296 to 300. Porsche upgraded the interior of the 911 Carrera 4 with new soft-touch grain instrument panel and interior trim, plus aluminum look trim items. The previously optional charcoal odor filter for the climate control system is standard for 2000. New standard colors for 2000 include Biarritz White and Speed Yellow. Rain Forest Green Metallic is a new optional color.

#### 300 Horsepower for 2000

For model-year 2000, a new exhaust system helps boost horsepower of the 3.4-liter horizontally opposed



six-cylinder "boxer" engine from 296 to 300. To upgrade interior quality, Porsche applied a new soft-touch grain to the dashboard and other interior trim. New aluminum-look trim accents the shifter knob, handbrake release button and inside door handles. Porsche also made the previously optional activated charcoal odor filter for the climate control standard equipment, and the rear seats now incorporate child seat attachments. The 911 Carrera 4 features three new standard exterior colors for 2000 -- Speed Yellow (formerly optional), Biarritz White and Rain Forest Green Metallic.


#### MY TIME
